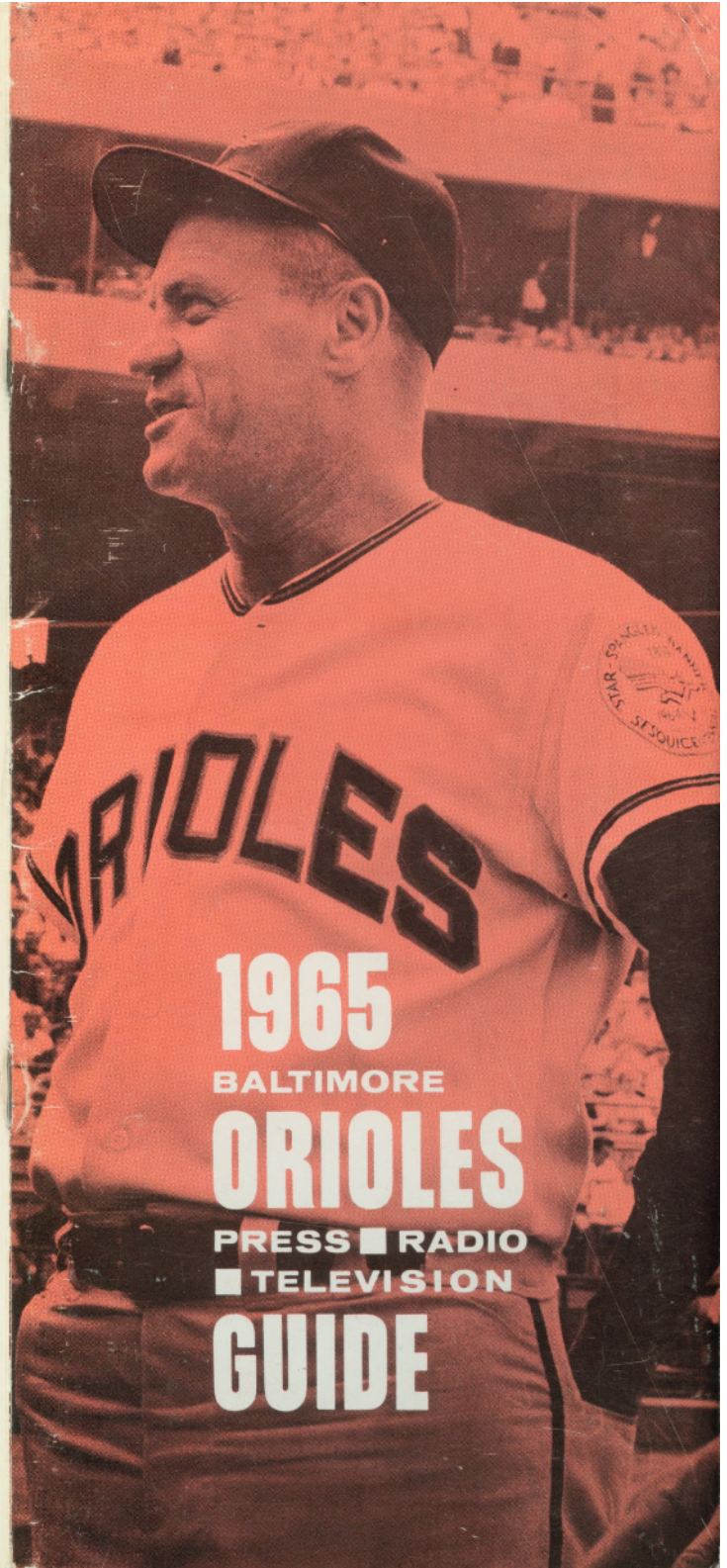

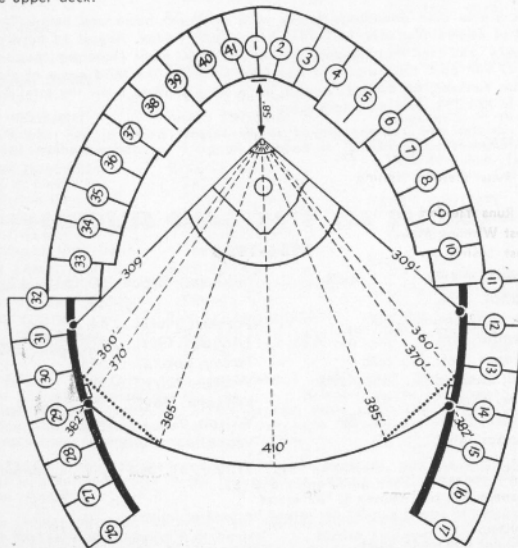

TRAVEL: From March to October the Orioles will travel over 33,000 miles as a club . . . They will make some 67 inter-city jumps including 44 by air, 21 by bus and two by train . . . There will be 33 charter flights and 11 trips on scheduled jets . . . United Air Lines will carry the club on 39 of their trips . . . Transportation will cost the Orioles \$110,000 (\$90,000 during regular season for 51 city-to-city jumps) . . .

Some Orioles will spend as much as 16 weeks in hotels from the start of spring training to the end of the season (112 days). Hotel accommodations and meals for the club will cost about \$95,000 (\$43,000 in regular season) . . .

MINIMUM MAJOR LEAGUE SALARY: A player is entitled to a minimum rate of \$7000 per year if he is on the roster during the period June 15 thru August 31 . . . If such a player was on the roster before June 15 he is also entitled to the \$7000 rate retroactive to the date he joined the club during that season.

A player who is on the roster before June 15, but who is no longer with the parent club on that date, as well as a player who joins the club after August 31 will be paid at the rate of at least \$6000 per year for each day of service.
